At Hatton Vale State School, we believe that learning is a partnership between students, parents and teachers. These Learning Statements have been designed to provide families with an overview of what your child will be learning and assessed on this term.

In English, students will:

- use reading strategies to develop their accuracy, fluency and comprehension including:
 - recognising cause and effect
 - understanding sequence
 - interpreting figurative language
 - chunking letters and sounds together
 - cross checking
 - flipping the sounds
 - adjusting reading rates
 - voracious reading
- listen to and read a variety of literary texts and explore how authors write persuasively
- analyse persuasive texts and examine ways persuasive language is used to influence an audience
- plan, write and edit a persuasive letter, demonstrating knowledge of grammar, punctuation and vocabulary

In Mathematics, students will:

- recall multiplication and related division facts to multiply two-digit numbers by single-digit multipliers
- interpret and solve multiplication and division word problems
- identify, represent and compare familiar fractions and recognise key equivalent fractions
- solve simple problems involving fractions
- make models of three-dimensional objects
- identifies symmetry and angles in familiar environments
- interpret simple grid maps to show position and pathways

In Science, students will:

- investigate how a change of state between solid and liquid can be caused by adding or removing heat
- explore the properties of liquids and solids and understand how to identify an object as a solid or a liquid
- make predictions, record observations, analyse results and communicate ideas and findings

In Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS), students will:

- represent data about places and compare places
- explain the importance of making decisions democratically and the role of rules in the community
- devise an action in response to an issue

In Health and Physical Education (HPE), students will:

- learn and practice cricket skills including striking (batting), bowling, catching, throwing and fielding
- develop an understanding of cricket rules and learn to play modified games

In the Arts, students will:

- develop aural skills by exploring, imitating and recognising elements of music including dynamics, pitch and rhythm patterns
- use movement to demonstrate an understanding of musical form, changing actions as the music changes.
- Rehearsing and performing music in unison and with accompaniment patterns
- explore representations of people, settings, ideas and story structure in advertising focusing on moving images
- explore visual conventions (visual capture, textural rubbing, painting, collage)
- plan and share an advertisement to persuade a target audience to protect an environment
