English	Students engage with a range of texts, that depict characters, settings and events. They will sequence ideas and use language features including topic-specific vocabulary. Science	Students describe the observable features of a variety of landscapes and skies. They consider changes in the sky and landscape and the impact of these changes on themselves and other living things. Students represent observable features and share ideas with others about changes in the sky and landscapes and how they affect everyday life.	Day and Night Sky	Weeks 7-10
HASS	Students explore the features of local places and how they have changed. They explore personal and local scale, and identify features of places as natural, managed and constructed. Students collect and record geographical data and information, such as observations and interviews to investigate a local place and how its features can be cared for.	Exam	Assessed in Term Two

Music	Students will develop listening skills and skills for singing and playing instruments. Students will be learning about the elements of music, exploring and responding to where, why and how people from First Nations Australians and other cultures experience music, and singing and playing music in informal settings.
