Prep Term Overview Term 1 2023 Aligned to the Australian Curriculum



At Hatton Vale State School, we believe that learning is a partnership between students, parents and teachers. These overviews have been designed to provide families with information about what your child will be learning and assessed on this term.

In English, students will:

- use reading strategies to develop their accuracy, fluency and comprehension including:
 - o concept of print front/back cover, title, where to start, left to right, return sweep and word to word matching
 - o recognise capital and lower case letters, sound symbol relationships and some high frequency words
 - \circ ~ understand concept of a letter, word, spaces in between words and a full stop
 - o listen with understanding
 - \circ ~ retell familiar stories and respond to questions about a story
 - o recognize rhyming words, produce some rhyming words, clap words in a sentence
 - o identify first sound and last sound in a word
 - o fine-motor manipulation to prepare for writing in Term 2
- listen and respond to a range of texts
- engage in multiple opportunities to learn through focused teaching and learning, play, real-life situations, investigations, routines and transitions

In Mathematics, students will:

- recall counting in ones, identify numbers, represent quantities, compare numbers, recall counting sequences
- match numerals to quantities, count forwards and backwards, compare quantities
- identify how objects are similar or different
- sort objects into groups
- identify simple patterns
- use positional language, identify opposites and represent locations

In Science, students will:

- use senses to observe the weather
- learn how to record observations using symbols
- suggest how the weather affects themselves and other living things

In Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS), students will:

- identify important family events in their lives
- respond to questions about their past
- identify similarities and differences between families

In Health and Physical Education (HPE), students will:

- participate in a program to develop gross and fine motor skills including running, skipping, hopping, jumping, galloping
- learn about concepts of space, boundaries and co-operating with peers
- explore what makes 'me' unique and what 'my' strengths and achievements are

In the Arts, students will:

- explore, improvise and organise dance ideas by exploring characters or action in stories or rhymes to make dance sequences using the elements of dance (space, time, dynamics, relationships)
- use fundamental movement skills to develop technical skills when practising dance sequences that explore ideas about characters
- present dance sequences that communicate ideas about characters to an audience
- respond to dances about stories and characters, considering where and why people dance, including dances of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and Asian dance
