

At Hatton Vale State School, we believe that learning is a partnership between students, parents and teachers. These Learning Statements have been designed to provide families with what your child will be learning and assessed on this term.

In English, students will:

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- use reading strategies to develop their accuracy, fluency and comprehension including:
 - making predictions
 - recalling facts and details
 - distinguishing between fact and opinion
 - voracious reading (frequently reading and re-reading a wide variety of texts)
- research a person of choice who had demonstrated leadership/courage/overcome adversity etc
- plan and write a biography
- present a multi-modal presentation to the class

In Mathematics, students will:

- select and apply mental and written strategies to solve problems involving the four operations
- use order of operations to perform calculations with and without brackets
- solve problems using the properties of angles on a straight line, vertically opposite angles and angles at a point
- make generalisations about angles, opposite angles and find unknown angles

In Science, students will:

- investigate the environmental conditions that affect the growth and survival of living things
- describe and predict the effect of environmental changes on individual living things
- develop investigable questions to plan and conduct fair tests
- collect, organise and interpret data from observations relating to their investigation
- describe and analyse relationships in data using appropriate representations and scientific language

In Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS), students will:

- investigate Australia as a nation using the relevant key inquiry questions, in the context of migration
- compare and contrast the experiences of the "10 Pound Poms" to that of post-Vietnam war immigrants
- explain the significance of the contributions of one individual or group who immigrated to Australia to the development of our society

In Health and Physical Education (HPE), students will:

- participate in physical fitness routines in preparation for the athletics carnival
- complete the multistage fitness test
- practice and refine athletic techniques for sprinting, relays, warm-ups, high and long jump, discus & shot-put
- describe their own and others' contributions to safety and wellbeing

In the Arts, students will:

- explore dynamics and expression, using aural skills to identify and perform rhythm and pitch patterns of music from around the world, including the music of indigenous cultures
- develop technical and expressive skills in singing and playing instruments with understanding of rhythm, pitch and form in a range of pieces of music, including in music from the community and from around the world
- rehearse and perform music from different cultures, including music they have composed, by improvising, sourcing and arranging ideas, and making decisions to engage an audience
- explain how the elements of music communicate meaning by comparing music

In Technologies, students will:

- explain how information systems meet local and community needs
- represent a variety of data types in digital systems
- design and create an interactive spreadsheet and share information ethically

In AUSLAN, students will:

- negotiate with each other to plan, organise and complete learning tasks and activities
- translate familiar texts from Auslan to English and vice versa, identifying which words or phrases require interpretation or explanation

• understand different ways that English words are borrowed into Auslan and identify connections between Auslan and other signed languages
