At Hatton Vale State School, we believe that learning is a partnership between students, parents and teachers. These Learning Statements have been designed to provide families with what your child will be learning and assessed on this term.

In English, students will:

- use reading strategies to develop their accuracy, fluency and comprehension including:
 - making predictions
 - recalling facts and details
 - distinguishing between fact and opinion
 - voracious reading (*frequently reading and re-reading a wide variety of texts*)
- understand that texts have different text structures depending on purpose and context
- explain how language features, images and vocabulary are used to engage the interest of audiences
- use language features to create coherence and add detail to their texts
- create texts that show understanding of how images and detail can be used to extend key ideas
- make a presentation of a poem, varying language according to context

In Mathematics, students will:

- demonstrate understanding of place value
- use scaled instruments to measure temperature, mass, capacity and length
- solves simple purchasing problems using a range of strategies
- calculate change for purchases

In Science, students will:

- investigate and apply the observable properties of ochre mixtures to explain how they can be used
- investigate a scientific question and make a prediction
- identify safety risk management
- choose a method with scientific reasoning and record accurate observations
- observe, explain and compare observations with prediction
- investigate the fairness of a test

In Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS), students will:

- recognise the importance of laws in society
- describe factors that shape a person's identity and sense of belonging
- distinguish between fact and opinion
- detect, share and respect differing points of view
- use subject specific language when communicating

In Health and Physical Education (HPE), students will:

- learn the techniques required to push, trap, dribble and tackle and apply these skills in a modified game
- explore the basic skills and concepts of field hockey

In the Arts, students will:

- develop aural skills by exploring, imitating and recognising elements of music including dynamics, pitch and rhythm patterns
- use movement to demonstrate an understanding of musical form, changing actions as the music changes
- rehearsing and performing music in unison and with accompaniment patterns
